

Requirements for the minor in ITALIAN, 2025-2026

All courses to be applied to the minor must be completed on a letter-grade basis. This includes both courses offered in Italian and those offered by other departments and applied to the minor.

UPPER-DIVISION

20 UD units are required, distributed as follows:

(Note that a single course can only apply towards one area requirement, including EAP courses)

- A. Italian 101 or 102 or 103 or 104 (required before taking other UD courses in Italian)*4 _____
 B. Italian 119A or 119B4 _____
 C. Three additional UD courses taught in Italian**12 _____

Notes:

- * Exceptionally well-prepared students may enroll concurrently in 101, 102, 103, or 104 and another UD course taught in Italian, subject to Program Director's approval.
- ** Courses taught in Italian do NOT include an "X" in the course number (X stands for taught in English).

Students who complete 4 units of ITAL 191I (a 1-2 unit enhancement section that can be taken concurrently with ITAL courses taught in English) may apply that credit in place of 1 course towards Area C (up to 2 total courses towards Area C can be satisfied by 8 total units in ITAL 191I).

We encourage all minors to take advantage of Education Abroad Programs in Italy.

Substitutions and waivers are subject to approval by the chair of the department.

Students must consult the *General Catalog* for prerequisites to required courses.

The following conditions must also be met for official recognition of the minor:

- The sponsoring department reports completion of the minor prior to the posting of the degree.
- At least 18 upper-division quarter units are completed for the minor. (Waivers cannot reduce the requirement below this number.)
- The UC grade-point average in **ALL** applied upper-division courses is 2.0 or higher.
- No more than 5 upper-division units overlap between this minor and the upper-division portion of the major(s) or other minor(s). If overlap is greater with the major(s), completion of the minor will not be formally recognized; if overlap with other minor(s) is greater, only the first minor reported will be recognized.
