

**Requirements for the minor in  
FRENCH, 2023-2024**

All courses to be applied to the minor must be completed on a letter-grade basis. This includes both courses offered in French and those offered by other departments and applied to the minor.

**Note:** Native and near-native French speakers are required to consult with the Undergraduate Advisor before enrolling for the first time in any French course in order to verify placement.

**UNITS TO COMPLETE**

French 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or equivalent..... 0-30 \_\_\_\_\_

**UPPER-DIVISION**

24 units are required, distributed as follows:

A. French 100..... 4 \_\_\_\_\_

**Note:** Students must complete French 100 before taking other upper-division courses taught in French. However, students who earn an A or A+ in French 6 may take French 100 concurrently with one of the courses from Area B or C (see Department for approval).

B. Linguistics, Advanced Composition, and Writing:  
 One course from the following: French 104A-B-C-D-E-F ..... 4 \_\_\_\_\_

C. Foundations of French and Francophone Culture:  
 Two courses from the following: French 101A-B-C..... 8 \_\_\_\_\_

D. Electives: ..... 8 \_\_\_\_\_  
 French electives may come from UD courses in French and Italian, or in Comparative Literature by petition provided the course is taught by faculty from the French and Italian Department.

**Note:** A maximum of 4 units from courses taught in English or Italian.  
**Note:** Courses from areas B and C may NOT be used as electives.

Substitutions and waivers are subject to approval by the chair of the department.

Students must consult the *General Catalog* for prerequisites to required courses.

The following conditions must also be met for official recognition of the minor:

- The sponsoring department reports completion of the minor prior to the posting of the degree.
- At least 18 upper-division quarter units are completed for the minor. (Waivers cannot reduce the requirement below this number.)
- The UC grade-point average in **ALL** applicable upper-division courses is 2.0 or higher.
- No more than 5 upper-division units overlap between this minor and the upper-division portion of the major(s) or other minor(s). If overlap is greater with the major(s), completion of the minor will not be formally recognized; if overlap with other minor(s) is greater, only the first minor reported will be recognized.
